Plan Early!

Christmas trees will not be collected as part of the garbage collection service this winter.



Christmas tree collection by Deffenbaugh is a two-fold expense for the city. There is an extra expense for collecting the trees and the expense of landfilling the trees. These expenses are in addition to, and much more costly than, operating the Christmas tree mulching sites.

So make your plans now on how you will dispose of your Christmas tree. There are three easy options:

- ▲ place your tree securely in your yard and wait for yardwaste collection to resume in April;
- ▲ take your tree to one of the collection sites using the same means you got it home;
- ▲ consider an artificial tree which can be used for many years.

Second in a series—

Recycling the Real Truth:

Recycling doesn't save many trees or natural resources and doesn't it cause pollution?

- ▶ It takes 95% less energy to recycle aluminum than to produce it from raw materials. Other energy savings are: 60% for steel, 40% for newspaper, 70% for plastic, 40% for glass. Landfilling never saves energy and produces an insignificant amount of energy from the methane gas produced.
- ▶ 94% of the natural resources used in America are non-renewable. Recycling lessens our dependence on non-renewable resources.
- ▶ Without recycling at the current level, within 10 years 60% more wood would be needed to keep up with the demand for paper.
- ▶ By 2005 recycling, including collection and reprocessing will avoid the production of 48-million tons of greenhouse gasses, the equivalent of the amount emitted by 36-million cars.

Making it even easier...

Have you ever been frustrated trying to find the clear garbage bags required for collection? You'll be glad to know help is on the way.

While the City does not specify a brand or manufacturer for garbage bags, the City has lent its name and **WASTELINE** logo to a manufacturer, Phoenix Recycling Inc., who developed a product specific for the Omaha market.

Both the bags and the box they come in are designed with important "point of use"

reminders that detail Omaha's garbage collection regulations.

The bags are available in 13 and 32 gallon sizes and have a drawstring closure. The bags are 1 mil. and 1.1 mil. thick respectively and were usability tested by City staff to ensure they would meet the rigorous demands of garbage collection.

The bags are available at many Omaha retailers including the following chain stores: Albertsons, Bag-N- Save, HyVee, Menards,



No Frills, Shopko, Target, Walgreens and Westlake Ace Hardware.

The City makes no profit from this program and you may choose any brand of clear bag that you wish.



Yardwaste

Yardwaste collection ends November 30, 2002

During the winter months, yardwaste is not collected—separately or with garbage. Yardwaste collection will resume in April 2003. During yardwaste season, there is no limit to the amount of properly prepared yardwaste that will be collected.


Yes!



-  Grass clippings and leaves.
-  Garden waste such as fallen apples, rotted or excess vegetables and fruit.
-  Trash cans up to 32 gallons and weighing up to 45 pounds, marked with a **YW** on both sides.



-  Unlimited number of properly prepared marked cans, paper bags or brush bundles.
-  Special yardwaste paper bags weighing up to 40 pounds.



-  Bundles of branches and brush, tied with string or twine. Bundles may weigh up to 30 pounds.
-  Branches may be up to 2 inches in diameter and 4 feet in length.

No!

-  Mixtures of yardwaste and garbage.
-  No lumber or treated lumber.
-  Litter, trash or garbage.
-  Whole cans of dirt or sod.
-  Street sweeping sand, litter or rocks.
-  Plastic bags of yardwaste.
-  Cardboard boxes of yardwaste.
-  Pet manure or kitty litter.
-  Branches over 2 inches in diameter.
-  Branches over 4 feet long.
-  Plastic twine, nylon twine or wire used on brush.
-  Rope of any kind.
-  Unbundled brush.

Collection Pointers

- Place all materials at your collection point by 6AM. 
- If your collection was missed, call 444-5238 *after* 7PM on your collection day.
- Leave a couple feet of space between your yardwaste, recyclables and garbage containers.

Recyclables

Paper sack #1—Newspaper (Do not use plastic bags)

- Includes: Coupons, advertisements, Parade section and all paper that came with the newspaper.
- Lay sack on top of bin.
- *Do not include:* phonebooks (see sack #2) or other paper, rubber bands, plastic bags.

Paper sack #2—Mixed Paper (Do not use plastic bags)

- Includes: Magazines, catalogues, phonebooks, cereal boxes, junkmail (including mailing labels and plastic windows), detergent boxes, greeting cards, wrapping paper, paperback books, office and school paper.
- Lay sack on top of bin.
- *Do not include:* pizza boxes, juice boxes, milk cartons, hardbound books, tissue paper, paper plates, or frozen food boxes.



Loose in the bin—Containers (Not in plastic bags)

- Remove lids and throw in garbage.
- Plastic bottles marked PETE ♻️, including: Bottles that held pop, cooking oil, mouthwash, shampoo or cleaners.
- PETE ♻️ *not included:* frozen food trays, plastic cups, toys, cookie trays, deli or produce containers.
- Plastic bottles and tubs marked HDPE ♻️, including—bottles and tubs that held milk, juice, cleaners, margarine, whipped topping, or yogurt.
- HDPE ♻️ *not included:* motor oil or auto product bottles, lawn chemical bottles, toys or cookie trays. No 5 gallon buckets.
- Glass bottles & jars.
- Aluminum cans & Steel (tin) cans, including—empty aerosol cans, empty and dry paint cans. *Tip: Place end (lid) of food cans inside can and crimp closed.*
- Corrugated cardboard. Flatten. Cut to 2 feet by 2 feet. Place in bin or on ground under bin.

Recycling Collection Tips

- Write your address on the bin using a permanent marker.
- Remove snap top lids and screw on caps from all containers and place in garbage.
- *Do not include:* plastic bags, Styrofoam®, motor oil bottles, plate glass, syringes, light bulbs, drinking glasses or pizza boxes.
- Flatten all boxes. Cut to 2 feet by 2 feet.
- Remove bin from curb as soon as possible after collection.
- All recyclables set out for collection must be in a green bin. (Except pieces of cardboard that should be placed under the bin)


Yardwaste collection ends the week of November 25 – 30

Garbage

Collection Missed? Call 444-5238 after 7pm on your collection day.

Because of state and federal mandates, there are limits to the types of waste that you may include in your garbage. Each household is limited to 5 properly prepared trash cans or clear bags of garbage per week.

Yes!



-  Trash cans up to 32 gallons and weighing up to 45 pounds when full.
-  See-through bags (clear bags preferred) and weighing up to 30 pounds when full.
-  Up to five containers of garbage per week (example 2 trash cans and 3 bags).
-  Place cans or bags within 5 feet of curb, approved alley or other approved location.

No!

- A mixture of garbage and yardwaste.
- Items outside a can or bag.
- Rocks, dirt and concrete.
- Dead animals.
- All liquids.
- Tires, engines or other large auto parts.
- Bulky items (couches, chairs, stoves, etc.).
- Dark plastic bags that you can't see through.
- Motor oil and automotive batteries.
- Cardboard boxes (empty or full) when not in a can or bag.
- Natural Christmas trees.
